Highlights of the community light-up night were touched upon. The activities for this event have been organized by the Dayton Ministerium and will involve many others from our community. Then on November 28th, our committee, along with others, will decorate the church and academy for the season. A few replacement pieces of equipment were purchased for our audio/visual and recording system in the church.

As always, the month of December is packed full with good things. December 3rd will be a day of worship, a Christmas program, a congregational Christmas dinner, and a visit from a special friend to the children. This day we will also begin our tradition of beginning each service with the lighting of candles on our Advent wreath.

On December 10th, there will be a brief congregational meeting following church for the purpose of electing officers for the coming year.

Two worship services will be held on December 24th. Our normal time of Sunday school for the adults will be held at 10:00, our morning worship will be at the normal 11:00 hour, and our special Christmas eve candle lighting service will be at 7:00 p.m. This is one of our favorite services of the year. We invite any and all to this wonderful service as we celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus.

The year will conclude on December 31st by worshiping together at 11:00 a.m. We invite everyone to come to church relaxed as we gather for Sweatshirt Sunday.

Women's Association

The Women's Association met on Thursday, November 2, 2023, with seven ladies in attendance. Joyce opened the meeting with prayer. She noted that the Thank Offering will begin to be collected this coming Sunday. She explained that the Women's Thank Offering is one of two special offerings collected by them throughout the year. There are seven projects this year which the Thank Offering will support. Six of them are within the U.S. and one being international.

Brenda had a time of devotion based on Colossians 2:3. The apostle Paul taught that trust in God is much more valuable than human wisdom or knowledge. Shirley Coover then prayed over the Least Coin Offering.

Joyce read the minutes of the previous meeting of October 5th. Shirley gave the treasurer's report.

The program included a time of sharing. Aldean read a variety of quotes reminding us of love, friendship, and choosing joy. Shirley Huff read a story regarding life in a nursing home and the "crabby old man". Shirley Coover brought an assortment of books for anyone to take home. She also handed out Women of God cards with each highlighting a scripture. Joyce has a Basket of Blessings with scripture cards that she also handed out. Each of us listed a blessing in our lives and we prayed for them.

Shirley Coover prayed a blessing for our refreshments and served apple pie and coffee.

We then began planning for the next meeting on December 7th when we will prepare Christmas bags and cards for a variety of friends who may be ill, shut-in, etc. Those wishing to donate to the bags may bring pre-packaged food items. We will also send cards of encouragement to young moms. They live such busy live and we want them to know that we pray for them. There will also be no lunch served at the next meeting but snacks as we normally do.

Joyce gave a report on the recent mission project of used eyeglasses. Sixty-eight pairs were packed and donated to those in need. It was also decided to donate to the Ministerium for new Christmas decorations for the community tree for light up night on November 19th. Also, our group would like to donate to the Dayton Firemen something of use to them, such as bottled water, snacks and cookies at a future date. We then closed with the doxology prayer. During the Advent season, we will journey through the book, "An Unlikely Advent" written by Rachel Billups.

The following is an excerpt from the Introduction part of this book.

"I watched as Carolyn, a member of the worship design team, gently unwrapped the delicate pieces of our church's beloved antique Nativity set, one by one. They were cast in white porcelain, and I had just learned that one of our church faithfuls had handcrafted each Nativity character and presented the set to the church. Worn by years of handling, certain characters were already chipped and stored out of sight until they could be properly repaired. Carolyn went on to explain that this Nativity set was special. At first, it had been displayed within reach of little ones walking through, but it didn't take long to realize that curious hands found their way to the manger unintentionally further damaging the set. The set had to be moved. So, we moved it together.

It's a beauty, I said, and I meant it. The Nativity set was gorgeous and pristine. It was beautiful, but honestly, a little unrealistic. The Holy Family huddled together in the dark dampness of a straw-filled cave seemed a far cry from the white porcelain I saw before me now.

Nativity scenes function as the centerpiece of nearly every Christmas gathering in our homes and in our churches. It's a holy spot that we attempt to re-create out of our interpretations of the Gospel stories. There are B-Players that usually emerge as "extras" in God's story. I realized over many years that I somehow relate more closely to the shepherds and magi than I do to Mary or Joseph, and definitely not the angels. Could it be that we are more readily to see ourselves in these unlikely characters surrounding the Advent Story?"

During the Sundays of Advent this year, we will focus on these less popular and unlikely Nativity characters: Zechariah, Herod, the Magi and the Shepherds, as we journey towards Christmas.

The Advent Wreath and Candles

Each year during the season of Advent, we display the wreath of evergreens and five candles, three purple, one pink, and one white. The evergreens symbolize everlasting life. The circle reminds us of God's unending love. The light of the flickering candle flames is a reminder that Jesus is the Light of the world and the darkness has not overcome it.

The first candle symbolizes **HOPE.** The prophets of the Old Testament waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival.

The second candle represents the **PEACE** that Jesus came to bring.

The third candle symbolizes **JOY**. The angels announced with great joy to the shepherds that Jesus came for humble people just like them.

The fourth candle symbolizes LOVE. God's love was revealed among us in Jesus. God is Love.

The final candle is white and represents the light and purity of **CHRIST.** It is placed at the center of the wreath for all to see His pure light.
